Biography



I was born in a little village called Mafi Anfoe in the North Tongu District of the Volta Region of Ghana, West Africa. My father was the late Herbert Tamekloe and my mother is Cecilia Kudze. I was born in 1961.

I attended part of my elementary schooling there and completed it at Kete-Krachi in the northern part of the Volta Region. I then proceeded to the Kete-Krachi Secondary School [which is now a senior high school] in 1977 and completed it in 1981.

My conversion to Jesus Christ was in 1978, when I was in senior high school. I became very active in both Christian fellowships in town and on campus—and was deeply involved in prison ministries for five years.

After senior high school, there was no support for my continued education. Yet, it was at that time that I received my call into ministry through a prophetic declaration. The Lord provided the resources through a cousin, Evans Atiamoah of blessed memory, to attend Maranatha Bible College in Accra, the capital city. I passed the entrance examination and commenced in 1987. I completed my studies in 1990.

The mission work was initiated in 1983; and it was four year's later that I got the opportunity to attend the Bible college. We planted seven churches between 1987-1990 when the team leader, Evans, was called up to the bosom of Abraham. I took over from there and led the team to plant 61 additional churches—with the greater assistance coming from Jubilee Christian Ministries, USA, through the Pastor-Support Partnership.

In areas where permission was not granted to begin churches, we realized that schools were urgently needed by the community. We planted the schools, and to date I oversee 14 schools with enrollment of 1,300.

I have attended several international conferences in South Africa, Cote D'Ivoire, Holland, Evangel

Fellowship International/USA, and domestic ones, to equip me to do much more. I was instrumental in the crusade for the release of about 5,000 young girls from fetish slavery in certain parts of our country of Ghana. Through various interventions, many vocational centers have been established by NGO's (Non-Governmental Organizations) and ministries. I also established one at Frankadua in 1997, where ex-slaves are being trained to acquire vocational skills so that they can be rehabilitated back into society. About 240 have been trained so far in the Frankadua Center. [Fetish slavery is instigated by fetish priests—the same as Voodoo Priests or witch doctors.]

In partnership with Art Alive Ministries, USA, I established an orphanage at Aflao, which now supports 40 orphans. Plans are ripe to build more facilities in order to increase the intake. There are many orphans in Ghana due to the HIV/AIDS menace; and this is a wonderful opportunity for the Church of the Living God to minister to them before they are lost.

I have also negotiated with the Chief of Awanyaviofo, who has since been converted, taught and baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, to donate 1,000-acre plot to us for agricultural projects. We are requesting \$5,000 to complete the site plan, indenture, and secure a certificate from the Lands Commission so that we can now source for funds for the project to take off. The proceeds will go a long way to support the mission work and the orphanage. Donor dependence will also reduce considerably. This will give us the encouragement to forge ahead and accomplish much for the Lord.

A friend of mine also wishes to donate a 10,000-acre plot to us for a retreat center, guest house, and a college to be sited on it.

FUTURE PLANS, TO ESTABLISH:

1. A large fish pond-Fish farming projects
2. A cold storage facility
3. A library complex and bookstores
4. More orphanages
5. Medical centers
6. A Christian university
7. A rehabilitation center to absorb drug users & harlots in the area.

[This is a great project: to train them to acquire vocational skills and give them so loans. This will help us to get involved in loans and savings skills for the members: that they can be blessed and also lend the support to the church planting projects.]
